SNMEDD, EPCOG, NMDOT and Applicants (Responsible Charge) participate. Feasibility reviews will be held as soon as possible to afford Applicants more time for final application preparation.</p>	January 6, 2023 through January 24, 2023 <i>(2 weeks<sup>+</sup>)</i>
<p><b>Final Application Preparation</b>                      Applicants have three weeks plus to prepare their TAP/RTP/CRP application(s) (as a single PDF), in this order: Cover Page; Table of Contents; D2-approved PFF; Project Prospectus Form (PPF); TAP/RTP/CRP Application; Buy America Acknowledgement; Resolution of Sponsorship (or official letter); ROW Letter of Support (if applicable); Project Location Map; and any additional documentation in support of scoring factors.</p>	January 25, 2023 through February 14, 2023 <i>(3 weeks)</i>
<p><b>Final Applications Due to SERTPO</b>                      RTPO planners receive final application(s). Applications(s) should be submitted by email. Please note that early email submission is encouraged as there is always risk in delivery (i.e., e-mail storage limitations, server difficulties, firewalls, spam folders, etc.).                       Application(s) must be received by respective SERTPO/COG offices by the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on the due date. E-mail submission receipt date/time must be dated no later than <b>5:00 p.m. on February 15, 2023</b>. SERTPO/COG contact information is listed on the next page.</p>	February 15, 2023 by 5:00 pm
